Watch and wait



Waiting for God to move

We meet online regularly with our Serve Globally colleagues for prayer and fellowship. At a recent meeting, Letha Kerl, Regional Coordinator for Europe, led us in a time of devotion. As Letha is getting ready to retire, she reflected on God's faithfulness over the years, the process of learning to trust his timing, and the excitement she experienced with each new adventure in mission. She and her husband, John, spent most of their adult lives on the mission field and raised 3 kids on multiple continents. Letha shared the following scripture:

Romans 8:22-28 (MSG)

²²⁻²⁵ All around us we observe a pregnant creation. The difficult times of pain throughout the world are simply birth pangs. But it's not only around us; it's *within* us. The Spirit

for full deliverance. That is why waiting does not diminish us, any more than waiting diminishes a pregnant mother. We are enlarged in the waiting. We, of course, don't see what is enlarging us. But the longer we wait, the larger we become, and the more joyful our expectancy.

²⁶⁻²⁸ Meanwhile, the moment we get tired in the waiting, God's Spirit is right alongside helping us along. If we don't know how or what to pray, it doesn't matter. He does our praying in and for us, making prayer out of our wordless sighs, our aching groans. He knows us far better than we know ourselves, knows our pregnant condition, and keeps us present before God. That's why we can be so sure that every detail in our lives of love for God is worked into something good.

We were deeply encouraged by the fact that we are not diminished by the waiting. Like an expectant mother, we grow larger (with hope, with wisdom, with joy!) as we wait for God to move. The waiting itself is not "lost time" as we might think. Just the opposite! As we wait, we are emptied of false beliefs, false perspectives and false expectations. We are also being filled with the Holy Spirit, with new inspiration, and with new purpose and vision. And we are being formed more and more into the image and likeness of Christ.

Sometimes, we get tired in the waiting because waiting is hard. When we need it most, God's spirit is right there beside us, helping us along (v. 26). Like a midwife, the Holy Spirit comes alongside us as we "labor" to work out our salvation. God's Spirit helps us to manage these birth pains and leverage them to produce good spiritual fruit. We do not wait without hope. We wait with joyful expectancy, trusting that God will complete the good work he started in us.

Just as a laboring mother endures the work set before her for the promise of new life, we, too, endure the work set before us--the hard, human and sometimes messy work as disciples of Christ--because we know the struggle will produce something far more valuable in us and through us than we can hope for or imagine.

As pastors serving in Germany, we have the privilege of watching and waiting with many. We seek to be faithful witnesses to the love and hope of Christ as we "weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice." As you will see, June was absolutely *pregnant* with opportunities to watch, wait, weep and rejoice with friends, near and far.



Waiting for baby

Speaking of watching and waiting, I (Stephanie) was invited to attend the upcoming birth of a German friend, "M." One of my greatest joys in ministry is accompanying expectant moms through pregnancy and helping them prepare emotionally and spiritually for delivery. I have found great strength in the encouragement of other women during my own pregnancies, so I welcome the opportunity to support other moms when I can.

A few weeks ago, M asked if I would serve as her support person at the hospital during labor. Without hesitation, I said "YES!" What a joy it will be to accompany M and her partner as they welcome their baby into the world. M is 43 years old and this is her first child after many years of waiting and praying for children. So, this is an especially meaningful time for her and her partner.

Please pray that the Holy Spirit would surround M and her baby for the task of labor and delivery. Pray for a quick, safe and healthy birth. And please pray that I would support her well so she feels empowered, encouraged and at ease. Her official due date is July 6, but her doctor suspects she will deliver any day now.

Waiting for a miracle

You may remember our newsletter story about an Iranian refugee named "S" who tried to leave Germany 3 years ago and was caught by the German border patrol. He was detained at an airport prison with a stern warning and threatened with deportation and/or imprisonment if it happens again. With the new government cracking down on undocumented immigrants, our dear friend has been given his official papers for deportation . He does not know when it will happen, but one day in the near future he will be picked up from his home and escorted to the airport--this time he will not have the chance to argue his case and return home.

S cannot return to Iran as he narrowly escaped the oppressive regime years ago as a Christ-follower. Going home would mean imprisonment, torture or even death. So, now he faces impossible odds. What does it mean to trust God in the waiting? Does he wait for the government to come knocking or does he try and come up with a plan to escape? All we can do is pray, listen and wait with him as he makes his decision. But the clock is ticking. Please join us in praying for S as he waits on God for a miracle.


