## Power to overcome



J's story of overcoming with prayer

One of the great joys of pastoral ministry is getting to walk with and encourage people through life's challenges. We get to see firsthand how the Holy Spirit works in and through the people of God to bring lasting healing and change. Very often our challenges are related to life in the physical realm: health, finances, work or relationships. But sometimes we face challenges of a different kind: those which are

## deeply spiritual in nature.

Our Pakistani sister, J, has endured a season of spiritual warfare which most of us can only begin to imagine. She shared her testimony recently at IKC and we wanted to share her story with you.

J says her parents are Christ-followers who taught her and her siblings to pray on a daily basis when they were growing up. In fact, before they were even allowed to go outside and play as children, each one had to go into the family's prayer room and spend time alone with God. While this often annoyed J, especially as a teenager who wanted her freedom, it also instilled in her the daily habit of prayer. A habit which she, at 29 years old, still adheres to every single day. She says this discipline of prayer, given to her by her parents, has become the most treasured part of her day.

Over the years, J developed the ability to see prophetic visions in her dreams. In Pakistani culture, dreams are highly valued and often viewed as a way to receive divine guidance or spiritual direction.

J and her fiancé met when they were kids. They played together nearly every day and she's always thought of him as a brother. But in 2019, she began to see him differently. In one of her dreams, God gave J a vision of the two of them at the altar getting married! Shortly after, the two began to develop feelings for one another.

However, in Pakistani culture, one's parents have a huge influence on who they will marry. J's parents preferred a different person for her. But J, being the strong-willed and independent woman she is, rejected their suggestion. This caused strife between them for some time. However, she prayed fervently, as her parents taught her to do, for God's will to be done and for her parents to come around and accept the man God had placed on her heart.

After months of waiting and praying, her parents finally accepted her decision and the two were engaged. J recalls that this is when her spiritual battle truly began. Instead of her usual inspiring visions and dreams, dreams in which she enjoyed breathtaking views of heaven, angel sightings and conversations with Jesus, J began to have terrifying nightmares. Nightmares so vivid they seemed real. She dreamed that her future husband turned to a skeleton in front of her at the altar. That her wedding dress was covered in human waste or was crawling with bugs. Sometimes when she woke up, the nightmare continued: she would see caskets and dead bodies in her room and sensed the presence of dark energy all around her.

The spirits even began to assault her physically. She would often wake up, feeling as though she was being suffocated, with scratch marks on her neck and arms. As a result, she developed severe anxiety around going to bed. Her doctors tried her on a number of medicines, but nothing helped. At the same time, her fiancé experienced spiritual warfare in other ways. He lost his well-paying job, had his identity stolen, and suffered great financial loss. The two began to fight constantly and wondered if maybe these were signs they should split

up.

But as J continued to pray, God continued to speak to her, comforting her and reminding her of the promise he made to her. "Do you trust me?" he said. "Do you believe I can do what I said I would do?" This

gave J courage and she chose to continue with the engagement.

As she persisted in prayer and shared her struggles with people she trusted, a group from IKC rallied around her in fasting and prayer. For months, people prayed that she would be released from spiritual oppression.

This past Sunday during worship, she shared her powerful testimony and announced that the dreams have completely stopped! She is once again able to sleep through the night, without fear. Praise God for his indescribable mercy and power. He promises never to leave or forsake us. J says she always felt his presence with her, even in the darkest of times. She clung to God's promises in his Word and continually submitted her will to his, trusting that he could act when and if he chose to.

As we think about J's testimony, Psalm 16:7-11 comes to mind:

I praise you, Lord, for being my guide.
Even in the darkest night, your teachings fill my mind.

8 I will always look to you, as you stand beside me and protect me from fear.

9 With all my heart, I will celebrate, and I can safely rest.

10 I am your chosen one.
 You won't leave me in the grave or let my body decay.
 11 You have shown me the path to life, and you make me glad by being near to me.
 Sitting at your right side, I will always be joyful.

People often ask J why she thinks God allowed these things to happen to her. She suspects these things were tests meant to strengthen and refine her prayer life. Also, God used this terrible ordeal to call the church to prayer. J told us recently, "My greatest test has become my greatest testimony." Isn't that beautiful? And true for each one of us.

Our God is sovereign, able to help, and is more powerful than any trouble or darkness we face in this life. He delights when we pray for one another and encourage one another to keep trusting and believing, even when we cannot yet see the way forward.

And for M to be encouraged and strengthened as she cares for their baby alone at home. May Christ surround this family with his angels--in both spirit and human form--as they take steps toward healing and wholeness and the abundant life Jesus promises.
