As I crawled into bed on Tuesday night and felt my body exhale, I was flooded with gratitude for our community in Ecuador—those who have always called Ecuador home and those who, like us, were migrants to the country—who so generously shared their lives with us, inspired this work, and taught us so much.



In the midst of the hatred and fear-mongering currently happening in the United States toward immigrants and refugees, it is essential that we all wrestle with a more robust understanding of Scripture's mandate to welcome the stranger. Chris's dissertation work and continued scholarship will help inform that wrestling and strengthen the conversation around migration in pastoral care, better equipping pastors and leaders to care for migrants in their communities and to lead their congregations to thoughtfully and boldly engage in loving their neighbors.

Perhaps I will get Chris to write a VERY brief summary of his dissertation for a future newsletter (is that even possible?!?) but for now I'm going to let him exhale and celebrate a bit. And finish all the lecture prep and grading that needs to be done to finish out this semester of teaching.
